They work alongside families offering support and information around parenthood and early parenting, from pregnancy right through to when your child starts school. The service offers support for all parents of all children (0-5), whatever their circumstances.

Health visitors are keen to hear your thoughts, feelings and experiences about being a parent – you can talk through any worries you may have. At the hubs you can also chat with other parents in a relaxed play environment for your baby. You can talk to your health visitor about anything which is on your mind, for example lots of parents seek support around:

The broad functions of The Alternative Education Commissioning Service are:

- Responsibility for commissioning and monitoring suitable education for permanently excluded pupils, and for other pupils, who, because of illness or other reasons, would not receive appropriate education without such provision.
- Supporting schools and pupils where behavioural difficulties are preventing pupils from accessing relevant education.
- The provision of training and advice to schools on exclusion matters; including specific Governor training.
- Attending Governing Body Meetings where pupil exclusions are considered.
- Supporting and advising parents where pupils on school rolls are not receiving appropriate education.

The Principal Officers and Caseworkers deal with enquiries around fixed term, permanent exclusions and positive referrals.

The Senior Caseworker deals with referrals for pupils who are pregnant, pupils with medical needs and Anxious School Refusers.

Improving the physical and emotional health of expectant parents through pregnancy, birth and beyond

Vulnerable pregnant women in Basildon and Canvey Island currently have poor access to personalised support to improve their physical and emotional wellbeing and build resilience in preparation for changes ahead. Furthermore many pregnant mothers feel negative about their community and distrustful of professionals.

The project will build upon our previous successful project in Basildon, expanding the service to Canvey Island. 3yr funding secured from Henry Smith Foundation will support sustainability. A continuum of informal one-to-one peer support at home and in hospital, from early pregnancy, through childbirth and post birth.

Volunteers with particular personal qualities and life experience will be recruited from the local area. They will receive on-going high quality accredited training and professional supervision that equips them to promote health and wellbeing and enable women to plan for the birth, manage their care and make informed decisions.

A weekly group exercise programme that improves physical and emotional wellbeing facilitates social support networks and promotes self-care. Pregnant mothers experiencing back pain, mental health issues and obesity will benefit. A fully qualified fitness trainer and health promotion specialist will deliver the sessions.

The Essex Youth Service Targeted Team supports young people through one to one and through group work Interventions. We work with young people 13-19yrs and up to 25yrs if they have a recognised special need. We work for a period of 3 months, identifying the barriers they need to overcome in order to move forward successfully in their lives. This could include improving attendance in education, post 16 options, accessing positive activities, increasing self-esteem and confidence and taking personal responsibility whilst building resilience An action plan is agreed in consultation with the young person and they are encouraged to follow through with actions set.

We understand that young people may not feel they need to change or not be ready to accept change, however if they are willing to explore areas of their life, this is when change can occur. The young person needs to be clear about the expectation on them to engage readily with the Targeted Youth Adviser and want to explore their challenges, opportunities and make change as required. We use a range of resources to support young people and where appropriate refer to other services and agencies for more

	specialised support.
